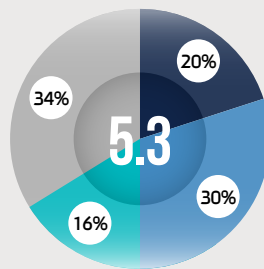

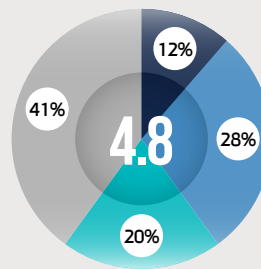
## Who should lead negotiations between Israel and its Arab neighbors?



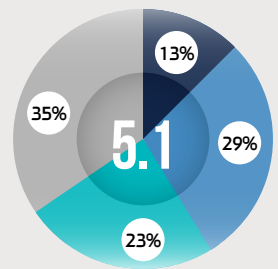
## The government's handling of foreign policy

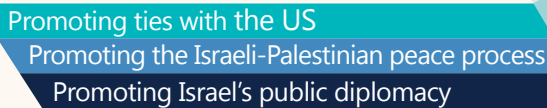


## Israel's global standing

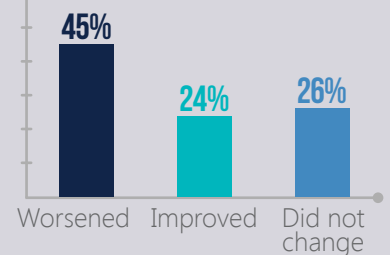

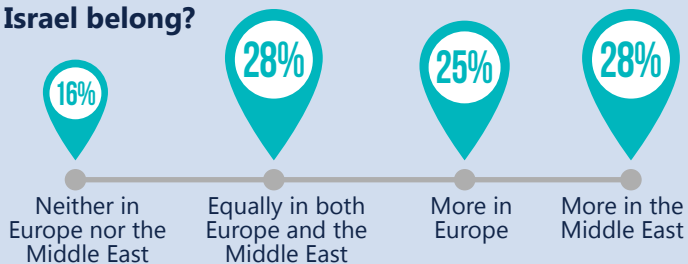
